There will be cash prizes for the winners and local celebrity chefs will be our judges.

The Opening Ceremony, "Dotting the Eyes of the Dragons" and the Cake Cutting event will be held on Saturday, April 29, 2017 at 10 a.m.

Dragon Boat racing has grown from its origins in ancient China, and is now an international sport all over the world.
