The 21st Annual Dragon Boat Festival and Races is coming to Austin on April 27 & 28, 2019. Come watch the spectacular 40-foot long boats racing to re-create a two-thousand years old Chinese tradition on Austin's beautiful Lady Bird Lake. Teams of 22 members from Samsung, Tokyo Electron, Wells Fargo, Intel, ARM, the Travis County Sheriff's Office, 3M, UT students and many others, including teams from Arizona, Houston and Dallas will battle it out during two days of fun, excitement, and camaraderie.

In addition to the races, this family-friendly, multi-cultural event offers different cultural music and dance performances, martial arts demonstrations, Taiko Drums, Lion Dance and a “Kids' Zone” with special activities for children on Saturday, April 27th.

In addition to the Dragon Boat races, Sunday, April 28 will have special performances of the Chinese and Indian dance and music. Savory and Sweet Dumplings with sticky rice wrapped in bamboo leaves are the traditional items eaten during the Dragon Boat Festival. The Opening Ceremony, “Dotting the Eyes of the Dragons” event will be held on Saturday, April 27, 2019 at around 10 a.m.

### **Admission to the Festivals for both days are FREE!**

Asian festival foods and souvenirs will be available for purchase on the grounds.

Dragon Boat racing has grown from its origins in ancient China, and is now an international sport all over the world. In honor of this ancient tradition, we are pleased to announce that Chinese government official representatives, Austin

City, Travis County and Texas State government leaders will be participating in the **“Dotting the Eyes of the Dragon”** ceremony prior to the start of the races. This colorful symbolic ceremony bestows the power of “vision” to the dragons so that they will fly on water in the races.

The Dragon Boat Festival and Races is organized by the Asian American Community Partnership and the Asian American Cultural Center. The Festival is partially funded by the City of Austin Economic Development/Cultural Arts Division and is supported by both public and private agencies and corporations.
